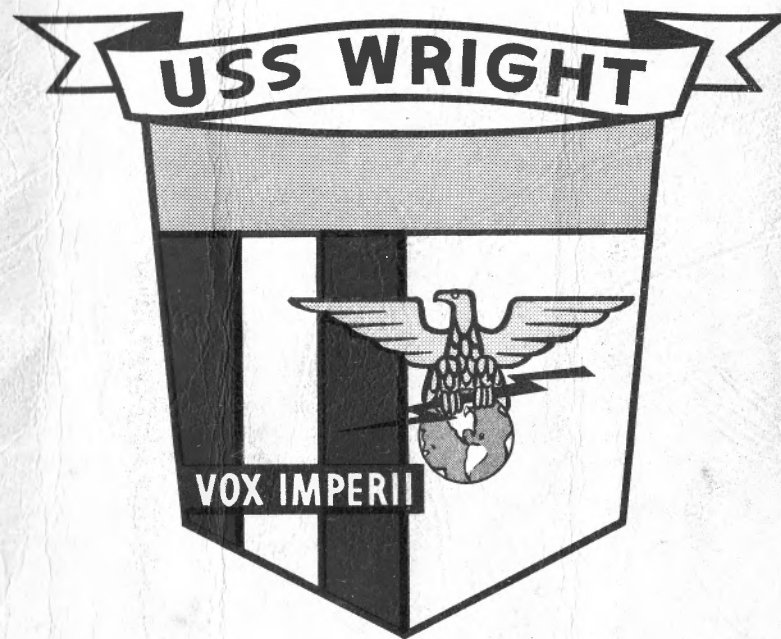

NAVAL COMMISSIONING

The Commissioning Ceremony marks the initiation of service of a ship with the operating forces of the United States Navy. At the moment of breaking her commissioning pennant, U. S. S. WRIGHT (CC-2) becomes the responsibility of her commanding officer, Captain John L. Arrington II, USN. Together with her officers and men, the captain has a duty to keep the ship constantly ready for any service demanded by our country in peace or war.

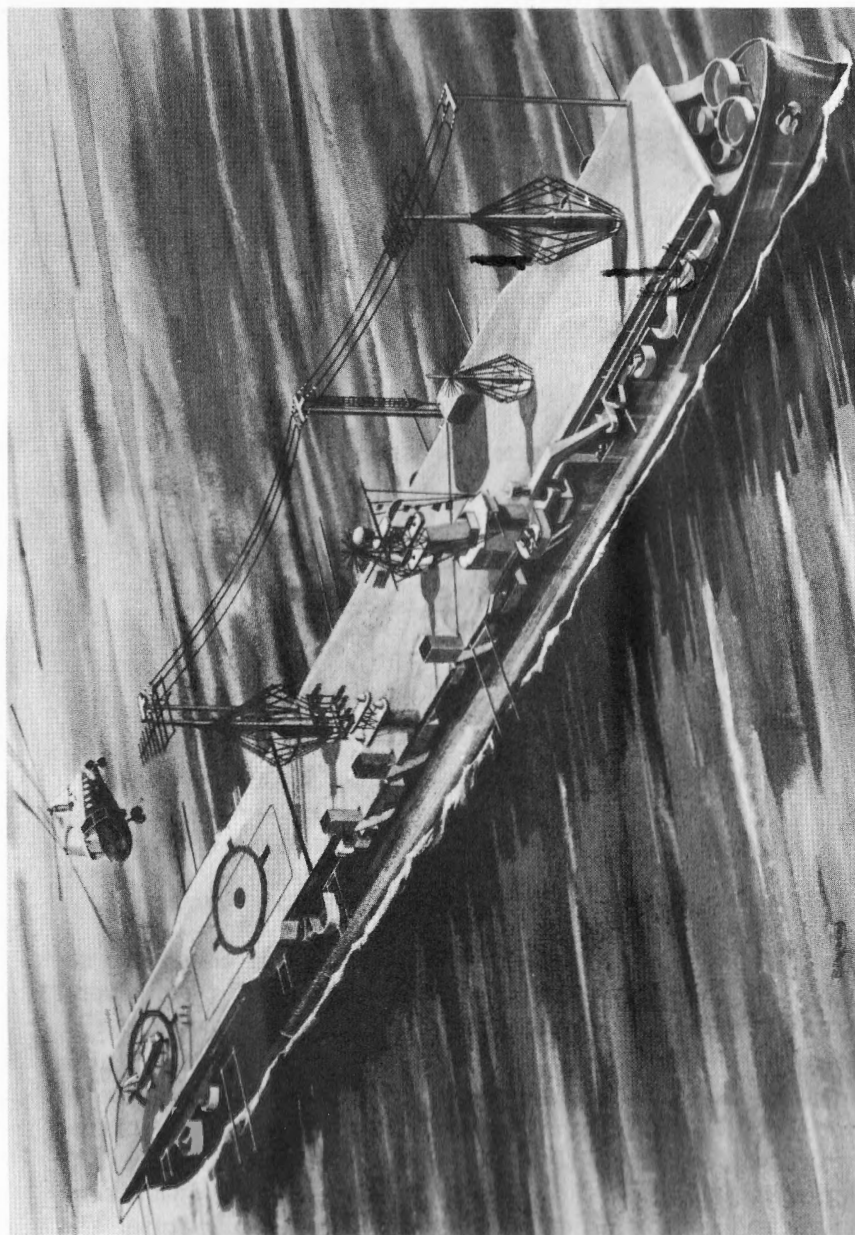

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SHIP'S CREST

The colorful ship's crest displayed on the cover was selected by the officers and crew of the WRIGHT from several "coat of arms" designs suggested by the ship's company.

The shield, representing the shield of the United States, and the eagle, both national symbols, denote the mission of the WRIGHT: To provide command and control facilities which will contribute to the defense of the United States. The lightning bolt and the globe represent the worldwide communications capabilities of the ship. The Latin phrase, *Vox Imperii*, means *The Voice of Command*.

THE STORY... OF THE USS WRIGHT

When the command ship USS WRIGHT (CC-2) joins the fleet early next year, she will be the first full scale conversion of a U. S. warship to serve as a mobile command post afloat. Aboard will be the means for worldwide communications as well as command and control facilities.

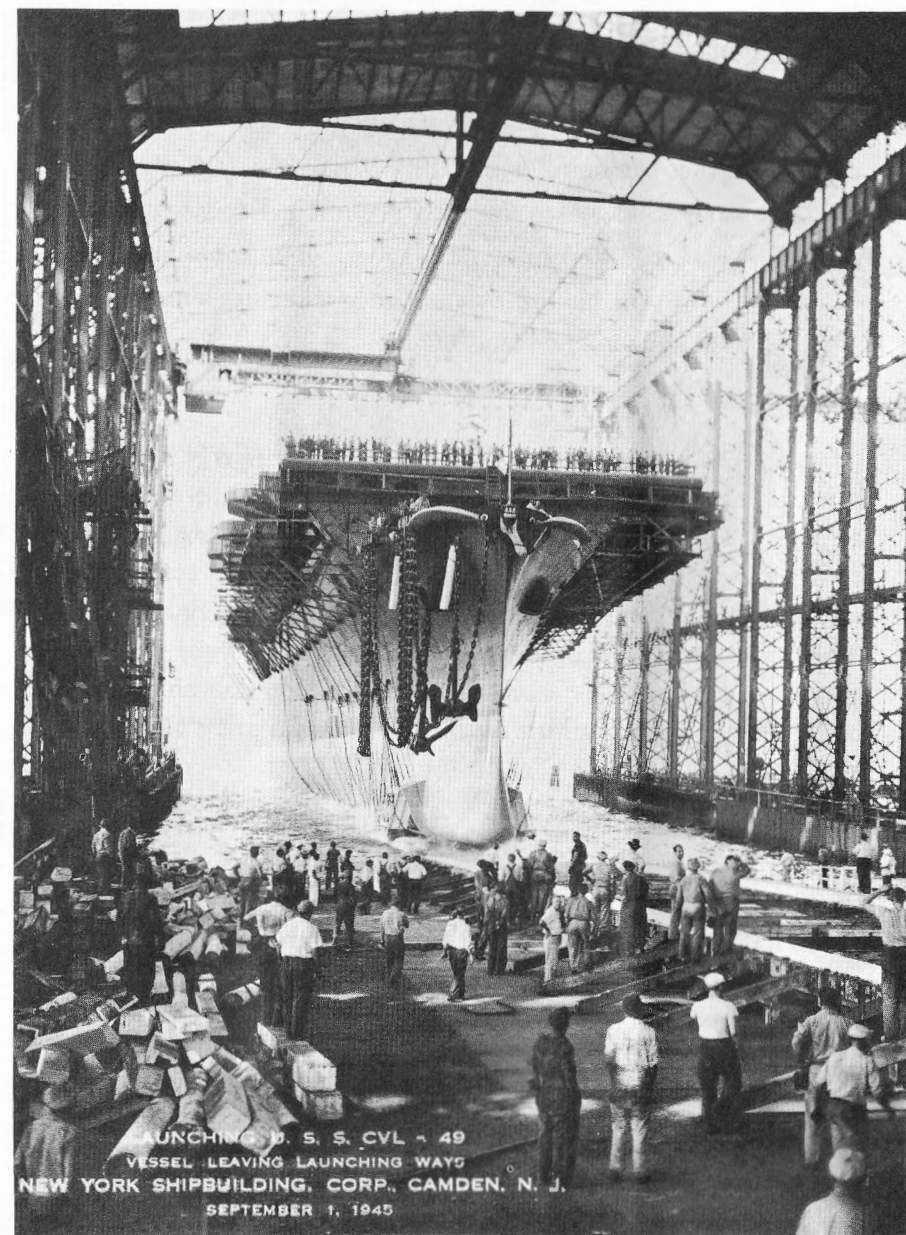

The USS WRIGHT is the second ship in the Navy to bear the name of Wilbur and Orville Wright, inventors of the airplane. The first WRIGHT was an aircraft tender, later to be renamed the USS SAN CLEMENTE. It was considered appropriate to perpetuate the name of the two aviation pioneers, however, so the name was given to the light aircraft carrier CVL-49. The carrier was launched and christened September 1, 1945, by Mrs. Harold S. Miller, a niece of Wilbur Wright.

On February 9, 1947, the WRIGHT was placed in commission by her first commanding officer, Captain Frank T. Ward. Following her initial shakedown cruise in April 1947, the WRIGHT went to Pensacola, Fla., for duty under the Chief of Naval Air Training. At Pensacola thousands of U. S. Navy pilots trained with the WRIGHT.

As part of the Hunter-Killer Force of the Atlantic Fleet, she participated in two NATO operations: Mainbrace in 1952 and Rendezvous in 1953. During 1953 the WRIGHT steamed more miles than any other carrier in the U. S. Atlantic Fleet.

Early in 1954, the WRIGHT underwent an operations readiness inspection and underway training in Guantanamo

Bay, Cuba, then was ordered to duty with the U. S. Naval forces in the Far East. Transiting the Panama Canal, the carrier paused briefly at San Diego and Pearl Harbor, arriving at Yokosuka, Japan, late in May with Marine Corps Attack Squadron 211 embarked.

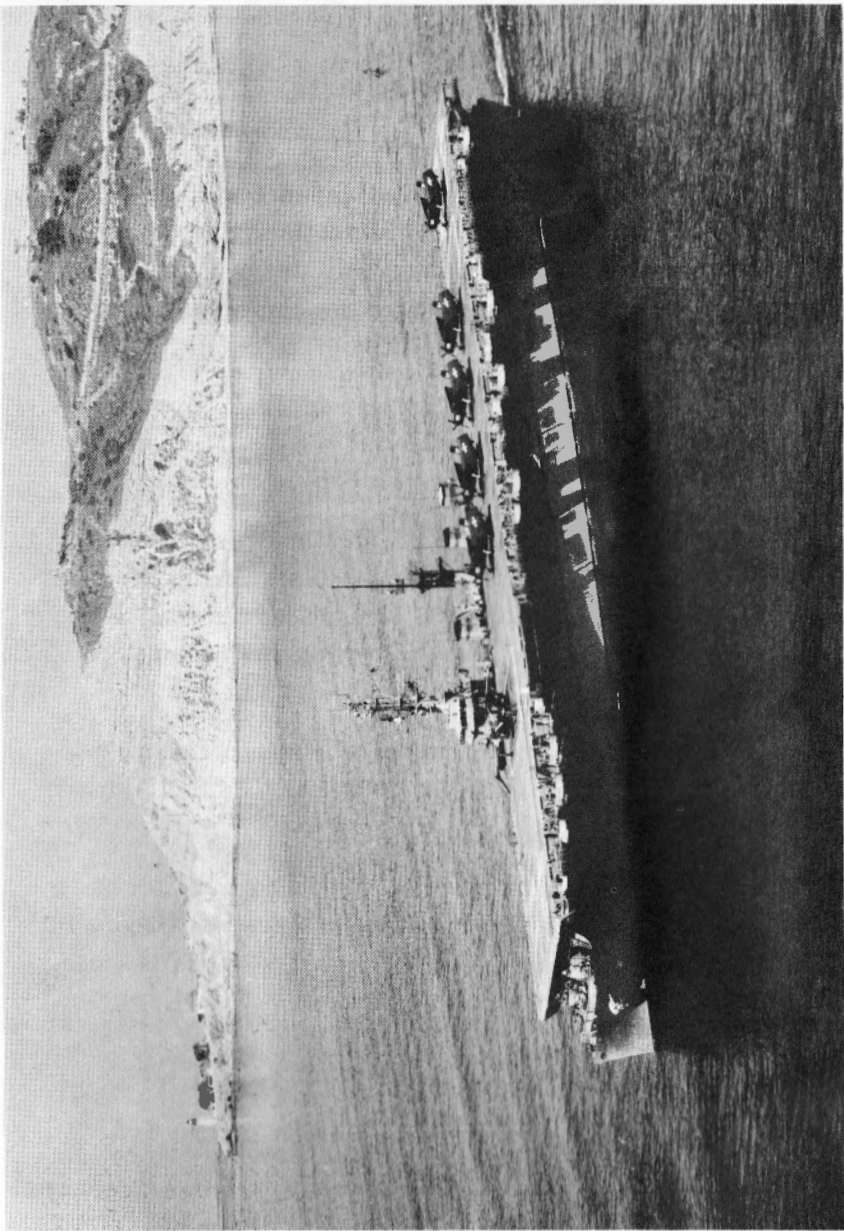
In September the ship departed Japan for Hong Kong, B. C. C., and six days of rest and recreation. She completed her far eastern tour a month later and steamed to her new home port, Long Beach, Calif., arriving there November 1, 1954.

The WRIGHT participated as part of Task Group 7.3 in the underwater atomic test, Operation WIGWAM, in the Pacific during May 1955.

Soon after the test, the WRIGHT left Long Beach for the U. S. Naval Shipyard, Mare Island, Calif., for inactivation overhaul, and on October 15, 1955, was placed "in commission in reserve" at Puget Sound Naval Shipyard, Bremerton, Wash. She was decommissioned March 15, 1956.

The former light aircraft carrier was reclassified an "aircraft transport ship" on May 15, 1959, and her hull number changed to AVT-7.

On May 14, 1962, the WRIGHT was pulled from her berth in the mothball fleet at Bremerton and work was begun to convert her to a command ship. The "new" WRIGHT is scheduled to be completed sometime this summer.

Rear Admiral Allan Lorentz Reed, who will deliver the commissioning address, was born in Manila. He was graduated from the Naval Academy with distinction, fifth in the Class of 1931.

Admiral Reed has served in a variety of Naval communications jobs, including communication duty in the Office of the Chief of Naval Operations in 1937 and 1938, communications security duty on the staff of the Commander in Chief U. S. Pacific Fleet in 1939, and as Assistant Director of Naval Communications for Cryptographic Aids in the Office of the Chief of Naval Operations in 1943 and 1944. While in the last post he was authorized to wear the Commendation Ribbon for service in the development of a combined Great Britain-United States cryptographic system.

As commander of the destroyer USS JOHN HOOD during 1944-45, Admiral Reed was awarded the Bronze Star Medal with Combat "V" for "meritorious service . . . against enemy Japanese forces in the Pacific."

Admiral Reed attained his present rank in July 1958. Shortly after he was assigned to the Office of the Chief of Naval Operations as Deputy Director of Naval Intelligence. He was Commander South Atlantic Force when ordered to duty as Assistant Chief of Naval Operations for Fleet Operations and Readiness, his present assignment.

He is married to the former Marjorie Hollowell of Seattle, Wash. They have two daughters.

Following his graduation from the Naval Academy in June 1939, Captain Arrington began his active career as the assistant navigator in the battleship USS IDAHO. Only a short time after reporting aboard, he was transferred to the destroyer USS GREER in which he served for three years during World War II in the Atlantic area.

During the remainder of the war he served in Pacific waters in the destroyers USS WALLER, USS LINDSEY, and USS McDERMUT, the latter of which he commanded.

Captain Arrington returned to school after the war, earning a master of science degree in electronics engineering from the Naval Postgraduate School in 1949. He has also attended the Armed Forces Staff College and the National War College.

Sea duty assignments since the end of World War II have included duty in cruisers and carriers, and command of the destroyer USS O'HARE and of Destroyer Division 322.

Shore duty has included tours with the Navy Department and with the United States Mission to NATO in Paris, France.

The Rocky Mount, N. C., native and his wife, Cherrie, have two children — Lindsay Anne, 14, and Christopher, 5.

Commander Van Pelt enlisted in the Navy in 1942 and received his commission in 1943. His first assignment was as recognition officer in the USS VICKSBURG (CL-86).

He has served in the USS MISSOURI (BB-63), USS VOGELGESANG (DD-862), USS IRWIN (DD-794), USS RAMSDEN (DER-382) and USS WALDRON (DD-699), commanding the latter two.

Other tours of duty have included serving as chief of staff for Intelligence and Security for Joint Task Force SEVEN and serving as instructor at the Combat Information Center (CIC) School, Boston, Mass., and Officer Candidate School, Newport, R. I.

He has attended the Navy Midshipman's School, Recognition School, CIC School and General Line School.

A native of Grand Junction, Colo., Commander Van Pelt is a graduate of Riverside Junior College, Riverside, Calif., and Woodbury Business College, Los Angeles, Calif.

The WRIGHT's executive officer is married to the former Miss Bernice Whitteaker of Riverside, Calif.
